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### MID TERM AND IN SERVICE EDUCATION TRAINING

School will be closed on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> February and Monday 13<sup>th</sup> February for the Mid-Term break. School will also be closed on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> February for staff In-Service Training.

On Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup>, some staff will attend training on Reflective Reading whilst others will be involved in training on the use of Digital Technologies in the classroom and on Dyslexia Friendly Approaches. The remaining teachers, PSAs and Early Years Practitioners will attend training about a classroom technique called "The Learning Pit" alongside myself and Mrs Willox.



On Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup>, teachers will be attending training on Moderation at Port Erroll School with other teachers from across the Peterhead Cluster. Mrs Willox and myself will be working with PSA staff on this day where we shall be looking in depth at Maths strategies.

### EXTRA CURRICULAR CLUBS (CHOIR / SPORTS ACTIVITIES / J ROCK)

It is vitally important that we account for all children's whereabouts if they are supposed to be attending one of our Extra Curricular clubs (Choir or Sports activities). In this regard I would request that, should your child be a member of choir/after school sports activity, and will not be attending on any occasion, that you inform school via telephone or letter so that the activity leaders are fully aware of any children who will not be attending. This will ensure that all pupils are accounted for and effective registration procedures can take place.



### ANNUAL QUESTIONNAIRES

As part of our Quality Assurance Procedures we would like to know how you feel about the work of the school. In this regard a set of questionnaires have been issued along with your newsletter. I would be obliged if you would give a wee bit of your time to complete a Parent Questionnaire (one parent questionnaire per family). I would also request that you help each of your children complete the Pupil Questionnaires individually. These should be returned to school by Friday 17<sup>th</sup> February. The results of these questionnaires will be collated and contribute towards forming some of our Improvement Priorities for next session. I thank you in advance for your cooperation in this matter.

### PARKING

I would like to extend my thanks to the majority of Clerkhill parents who park considerately in the streets around school at drop off and pick up times - your consideration is much appreciated. Unfortunately a small number of parents are still parking in the school car park at drop off and pick up times. Again I would request that parents refrain from doing this as it compromises safety for



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children who may be walking through the car park at those times and also makes parking for school staff who start work at 9am very tricky.

I would also request that, when parking on the streets that surround Clerkhill, you park safely and considerately.

### PUPIL COUNCIL NEWS

Our pupil council have recently been very busy supporting pupils around school log how they come to school on a Wednesday. This is an Aberdeenshire initiative (run by Living Streets) which encourages pupils and their parents to become more active and walk to school or indeed park and stride at least once a week. All pupils in school will log how they come to school each Wednesday initially and if they walk/scoot/bike/park and stride to school each Wednesday in a month they will receive a PIN badge for their efforts. Not only will this encourage our pupils to engage in a healthy life style it will indeed help to alleviate some of the parking issues which cause problems at drop off and pick up times



### "SCURRIES"

We have been encountering some issues recently with seagulls hovering over our playgrounds especially at playtimes when pupils have food outside. In an effort to minimise the presence of the seagulls, starting on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> February, all pupils who have a playpiece with them to school will be asked to eat their snack in their cloakroom before heading out to play. Pupils who are eating snack indoors will be supervised by Pupil Support Assistants. Once their snack is finished they will head out to play. In order to ensure that pupils have time to both eat their snack and still have some time to play outside, I would request that the snack you provide your child with is easily eaten and not too large!



### ADDITIONAL SUPPORT FOR LEARNING PROVISION

At Clerkhill School we are very ably supported by two Additional Support for Learning teachers. These teachers support many learners across school in Numeracy and Literacy both within classes and through small group work. The nature of their support can vary throughout a school year with some children receiving support for short periods of time and others for more extended periods of time. Mrs Janie Owen (our full time Additional Support for Learning teacher) will be available for parents to chat with during our school Open Afternoon on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> March and again on Parents Evening on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May.



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### SHOE CHANGING / INDOOR SHOES / PE KITS

As of Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> February also, our P1 & P2 pupils will not change into indoor shoes once in school. The rest of the school currently do not change shoes. I would, however, request that all pupils keep an indoor pair of trainers or gym shoes in school to change into for PE or indeed if there is a particularly wet day and they need to change wet footwear. It is also vitally important that pupils have a full PE kit in school at all times to enable them to participate in a vitally important part of their learning.

### CLASS OUTINGS

Several of our classes have trips planned this term.

As part of their "Jacobites" topic, P5M & P5R will be visiting Culloden and Fort George on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> March.

As part of their "Space" topic, P3C & P3S will be visiting Satrosphere to participate in some fun, hands on scientific investigations on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> March.

### MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

Should you require your child to self-administer medication in school or, indeed, should you require school staff to administer medication, parents **MUST** hand all medicines into the school office and complete the appropriate paperwork. Pupils are not permitted to carry any medication in school and likewise, school staff cannot administer medication without the required paperwork being completed.
