### Comic Relief

Friday 18<sup>th</sup> March was a fabulous day of fun and games at our school as we participated in a variety of fundraising activities for Comic Relief. Thanks to your generosity a grand total of £1728.22 was raised on the day. £471.61 of this will be donated to a charity supporting the provision of aid to Ukraine.

As well as raising lots of money for these worthy causes, the day was extra special as we all came together for our first in-person assemblies in two years. The children all behaved very well and it was just delightful to have them all together after such a long time.







### Education Scotland Recovery Visit

We are very excited to be receiving a visit from Her Majesty's Inspectors from Education Scotland on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> April 2022. The team visiting us will be evaluating the work the school has done in response to the pandemic and how we have ensured continuity of learning for our young people as well as how we have supported them over these past two years. During their time with us the team will visit all our classes, meet with our Pupil Council and representatives from some of our other Wider Achievement groups. They will also meet with a group of parents and hold drop-in sessions for staff.

### **Election Day**

As our school is being used as a Polling Station on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> May, the school will be closed on this day. Online Learning will be provided and can be accessed via your child's Teams page.

### COVID

I am delighted to report that new Guidance for Schools sees many of the current mitigations in school lifted, as of Monday  $18^{th}$  April.

Parents and staff no longer need to wear masks in outdoor areas and parents of pupils in P4 and above may now wait within the school grounds should they wish to do so at the end of the day.

Although staff will still need to wear masks in the corridors and communal areas in school, they may now be removed within the classroom, should staff wish to do so. Any staff member wishing to continue wearing a mask within the classroom will be supported to take whichever decision they feel is best for them. Please see specific details on updated school guidance below:

- Children, young people and staff must stay at home and self-isolate if they:
  - have symptoms of COVID-19, whether they feel unwell or not
  - have tested positive, even if asymptomatic
  - are required to self-isolate for any other reason in line with the requirements set out on NHS Inform
  - are identified as a close contact and are over 18 years and 4 months and not fully vaccinated



- From 18<sup>th</sup> April 2022, there is no longer a requirement for schools to issue individual information ("warn and inform") letters to low risk contacts when positive cases are identified, or for them to test prior to returning to the school environment provided they remain without symptoms
- Washing hands thoroughly, at the right time, using appropriate facilities and products helps to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Schools should continue to support staff and children and young people to follow advice on good hand hygiene, and to ensure regular surface cleaning in schools and on school transport
- While face coverings will not be required in classrooms, including for learners in the senior phase sitting exams, learners and staff should continue to be supported to wear them if they choose to do so.
- Physical distancing children, young people and staff should follow the wider societal guidance on physical distancing in schools or on dedicated school transport. As in wider society it will remain important to be cautious and exercise personal responsibility, recognising that, where possible, it is safer to keep a distance from other people
- There are no restrictions on indoor and outdoor drama activity, music, PE or dance. Routine measures should continue to apply in relevant settings where these activities are taking place (e.g. good ventilation).
- School day visits and residential stays are permitted in keeping with guidance on school visits and trips: Coronavirus (COVID-19): school visits and trips - gov.scot (www.gov.scot)
- There are no restrictions on assemblies, although routine measures will continue to apply (e.g. good ventilation, regular cleaning, etc)
- There are no restrictions on parents, carers or wider family members entering school buildings, although they will be expected to comply with the school's routine measures. There are therefore no restrictions on "in person" parent/carer evenings, parent/carer related events and meetings in school buildings, e.g. subject choice events, career events, fundraising events, family learning activities, volunteering in school, Parent Council, Parent Teacher Association meetings and other similar events or meetings.
- Parents, carers and family members are able to attend indoor and outdoor sporting and cultural events



As many mitigations have been lifted we shall be making some slight changes to our start and end of day procedures for our P3-7 pupils.

All current arrangements for P1 & P2 classes will remain as they currently are.

### P3-7: Start Times and Entrances / Exits

#### P3 & P4

- Pupils will <u>all</u> assemble in the <u>middle playground</u> in the morning and enter through the
  door which faces this playground (this is a change for our pupils in P3/4A and P4M teachers will have run through this new arrangement with their class so they will be
  familiar with the new routine for the start of term)
- Doors will be open from 9:00 9:05 for pupils to come into school
- Pupils will still have their hands sanitised on arrival
- Staff will be on duty in the playground in the mornings (from 9:00am) to ensure pupils are clear on new arrangements
- Pupils will all exit into the middle playground at the end of the school day (again a change for those in P3/4A and P4M - parents should wait for their child in this playground at the end of the day if they are collecting them from the playground)

#### P5-7 pupils

- All P5-7 pupils will assemble in the front playground in the mornings
- All P5 & 6 pupils will enter and exit through the "Senior End" door
- All P7 classes will enter and exit through the door at the top of the steps in the front playground
- Doors will be open from 9:00 9:05 for pupils to come in to school
- Staff will be on duty in the playground in the mornings (from 9:00am) to ensure pupils are clear on new arrangements
- All P5-7 pupils will be dismissed into the front playground at the end of the day

## Class Topics

Over the past term, our whole school have been focussing on "Our Healthy World", "Internet Safety" and "My World of Work". Classes have enjoyed learning about a variety of jobs in our community and about the many skills needed for different careers.

Next term our whole school focus will be "Our Local World", a Health focus and then Transition Focus.



### John Muir Group and Queen's Green Canopy

Our John Muir group had visitors at the Brave Community Woodlands on the 23<sup>rd</sup> March. Deputy Lieutenant of Aberdeenshire Douglas Fowlie, Mrs Murray and volunteers from the Brave Outdoors Community Woodland joined them to mark Her Majesty the Queen's Platinum Jubilee by planting a selection of trees.

The Green Canopy tree planting ceremony is part of a series of events across Aberdeenshire and beyond marking this most remarkable milestone of the Queen's reign, which began in 1952. As part of the Green Canopy, the Woodland Trust gave trees to schools and community groups. In a joint venture, Clerkhill School and the Community Woodland secured 420 trees which all have berries or fruits to encourage more biodiversity to the woodland.

The John Muir Group has been visiting the woodland since August and have been developing perseverance, resilience, and team building skills through different activities such as den building, identifying trees, campfire cooking and helping to create footpaths in the woodland. As part of the award the pupils must discover, explore, conserve and share their experiences of a wild place. The John Muir Award pupils planted the trees as part of the 'conserve' element of their award.

### Netball
