Science Club

Despite the very snowy weather, Mrs Pressley and a group of parents accompanied our P7 Science Club to their regional competition in Aberdeen on Thursday 9th March. Like their Lego League peers, our budding scientists worked hard to prepare for their competition during their after school club each week, under the skillful direction of Mrs Pressley. Both teams had to present to a group of judges what they had been learning each week at Science Club. Once again our Science Club were very successful in this competition, winning the Climate Smarter Award for designing and building a model

a sustainable, eco friendly school. The Carbon Capture and Storage Award was where the team had to conduct several experiements and research into Carbon Dioxide and it's effects on the environment. Once again, Mrs Pressley and her scientists won the coveted title of "Regional Science Club of the Year" for the fifth time.
