
Stakeholder Engagement and Feedback Surveys

Sponsored Walk

Wet Weather Arrangements

Should the weather be inclement in the morning, playground doors will be opened at 8.50am to allow children to shelter from the rain. However, on such days, parents should try to take children to school as close to their class' starting time as possible.

It is at the Head Teacher's discretion that the doors are opened prior to 9:00am on days when the weather is bad. Acceptable standards of behaviour are expected at these times.



If the weather is inclement at lunchtimes, children who are returning from home dinners should return to school no more than five minutes before the bell. On their return to school, pupils should enter via the main door as individual playground doors will not be open.

Again, an acceptable standard of behaviour is expected at these times.

Parent Council and Parent Staff Association (Fundraising Committee)

Our next Parent Council Meeting takes place on Thursday 4th November at 6:00pm (via Microsoft Teams). A warm invitation is extended to parents in this regard.

Our Fundraising group continue to think creatively to enable them to continue their fundraising efforts, even with the current school restrictions still in place. Without the support of our PSA group, our pupils at Clerkhill would not benefit from the many extras they do. Much of the money raised last session and, indeed from our sponsored walk will be used to fund our Christmas Parties and gifts and also to help us purchase some additional resources for our new literacy scheme.

CLASS TOPICS

Over the past term, our whole school have been focussing on "Our Historical World".

Next term our whole school focus will be "Our Caring World" and then "Christmas".

IN-SERVICE TRAINING

Our staff are going to be very busy on our two In-Service Days in November where we will be looking at Whole School Nurturing approaches as well as spending time looking at our attainment data and engaging in further literacy training.

COVID MITIGATIONS and MININISING RISK

As you are well aware, COVID is still very much in our midst and, once again, I would like to extend my appreciation to you all for your co-operation with us in this regard, as we try to minimise school transmission as much as possible.

Just a very brief reminder of the following:

- If anyone in your household is displaying any symptoms of COVID (new or persistent cough, temperature of 37.9 degrees or above, or loss of smell or taste), then pupils from that household <u>MUST NOT</u> attend school until the symptomatic person has received a negative PCR test
- If the symptomatic person receives a positive PCR test then pupils may not return to school unless they also receive a negative PCR test
- They may return to school once this negative PCR test has been received AND they have NO COVID symptoms



Christmas Arrangements

Unfortunately again this year we are unable to have parents in to school to view our Christmas Concerts in person. We will however be putting together a concert, will have this recorded and shared with parents via secure You Tube link.

We shall be having Christmas parties for our pupils this year and these will be funded by our Parent Staff Fundraising Association.

Car Park

May I take this opportunity to remind all parents and carers that our school car park is for staff and disabled parking, taxis, deliveries and after school pick ups and drop offs <u>ONLY</u>. The car park must not be used by any other parties for picking up or dropping off children.

Playgrounds

Lastly, may I also remind parents that dogs are not allowed in our play areas at drop off or pick up times. This is to ensure we keep all our children safe until they leave the school grounds. The riding of bikes and scooters within the school grounds (by any of our pupils or indeed younger siblings) is also prohibited. Again this is to ensure the safety of all our pupils whilst in the school grounds.

Our COVID mitigations still request that we keep the amount of adults gathering in the playgrounds to a minimum. Parents of pupils in P1-3 may enter the school grounds at the start and end of the day but I would request that you arrive as close to your child's start time as possible and also vacate the school grounds as swiftly as possible at the end of the day. Parents of pupils in P4 may now enter the front playground to collect their child at the end of the day, should you wish to do so, however I would request that you remain socially distanced and also stay towards the wall which backs onto Cairntrodlie.

Finally, may I once again remind parents that, unless exempt, masks should still continue to be worn when you enter school grounds. We would also appreciate if you could try to ensure your child has everything for the day ahead with them to school. This is to minimise the amount of adults accessing the school reception. Unless absolutely vital, parents should not be entering the school building.

Thank you for your co-operation in these matters.
