<p><u>Writing</u></p> <p>Practise this week's phonic code by completing a draw and write activity. The draw and write activity will be sent to each pupil individually.</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Draw a picture from your reading book and write about the story in your own words. Remember to use capital letters, full stops, finger spaces and any other targets you are working on.</p>	<p><u>Number Bonds to 5/ 10/ 20</u></p> <p>Using 5 counters/ beads/ pieces of pasta, whatever you have at home, find out all the different ways of making 5 using the adding symbol, for example:</p> $5+0=5$ $4+1=5$ $3+2=5 \text{ and so on}$ <p>This can be done for numbers to 10 and numbers to 20.</p>	<p><u>Scottish Focus</u></p> <p>Continue to practise your Scottish poem for our poetry competition.</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Design and make their own kilt for the kilt competition.</p>
<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Read your reading book with a family member. Then:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Retell the story to your family member using your own words.• Tell your family member what your favourite part is and why.	<p><u>Addition and Subtraction</u></p> <p>Using counters/ beads/ pieces of pasta, whatever you have at home, play games where you add two collections together to find the total.</p> <p>We have been talking about "counting all" the counters to find the total and we have also been talking "counting on" from the largest number to find the total.</p> <p>For example, $6+4=?$</p> <p>Have 6 in your brain box and count on four more, 7, 8, 9, 10.</p>	<p><u>Outdoor Learning</u></p> <p>Wrap up warm and get outside in the snow for some fun!</p> <p>You could:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Make a snowman.• Make snow angels.• Go sledging!
